Consider Approval: a one year extension of time to complete proceedings for the City of Mendota "Amador-Smoot Reorganization." An approved reorganization consisting of the annexation of 14.61 acres to the City of Mendota and detachment from the Fresno County Fire Protection District, the Westlands Water District, and the Silver Creek Drainage District for territory located on the northwest corner of Smoot Avenue and the Amador Avenue Alignment. Recommendation: Approve a one year extension to complete proceedings

Executive Summary

The City of Mendota has requested a one year extension of time, to December 16, 2022, to complete proceedings for the City of Mendota "Amador-Smoot Reorganization" (Attachments "A" and "B"). This reorganization was approved by the commission on December 16, 2020. State law requires that all reorganization proceedings shall be completed within one year of approval unless the Commission grants an extension of time prior to the expiration date. Failure to grant an extension will terminate the proceedings.

In accordance with Fresno LAFCo Policies, Standards, and Procedures Section 315-03, extensions of time may be granted when the imminent need for the proposal still exists, the project is still viable, and progress is being made toward completion. The Commission's Policies further state that the Commission may consider economic hardships beyond the control of the proponents as justification supporting the extension request.

Request for Extension of Time

Mendota's city planner Jeffrey O'Neal has requested the extension to time to complete the land acquisition by the City of property that is owned by the Westlands Water District. This acquisition is a condition of LAFCo's approval. He writes, "the District has placed a number of conditions on its conveyance of the land to the city, some of which involve determinations to be made by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation regarding its land retirement settlement agreement with the District.... The city cannot fulfill the conditions placed on it by the District in time to complete the reorganization and has requested an extension of 12 months to complete the necessary actions."

Extension of Amador-Smoot Reorganization (RO-20-14)

Mr. Fey:

The Amador-Smoot Reorganization was approved by LAFCo on December 16, 2020. The intent of this letter is to request that approval be extended for one year, until December 16, 2022. Enclosed is a check in the amount of \$250 for processing.

As you are aware, Westlands Water District (District) owns a portion of the subject area, which it intends to convey to the City of Mendota (City) as part of a larger parks and recreation project. The annexation was conditioned upon the City acquiring that land from the District prior to recording the Certificate of Completion. Outside the reorganization process, the District has placed a number of conditions on its conveyance of the land to the City, some of which involve determinations to be made by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) regarding its land-retirement settlement agreement with the District. To this point, the City has engaged Reclamation about its role in the process and is awaiting a response or determination. Until the roles and responsibilities of the three agencies are established, the City cannot fulfill the conditions placed on it by the District, and therefore cannot acquire the land and meet the condition imposed by LAFCo. To accommodate the necessary discussions and actions, the City requests that the Commission provides a 12-month extension to the approved annexation.
